### THEFT ALLEGED AGAINST NOTTM. HUSBAND AND WIFE.

Owing to the illness of the lady in the case the magistrates at the Nottingham Guildhall to-day granted an adjournment until January 8th of the hearing of charges against the Rev. John Godsell Prentice and Hilda Prentice, his wife, residing at 240, Derby-road, Nottingham.

The latter is charged with the theft of 664 tickets, value £12 9s. 4d., between March 1st and December 4th last, from the Church Army, and her husband with aiding and abetting her, while on another count Prentice is charged with obtaining food and cigarettes, value 7d., and Mrs. Prentice with aiding and abetting.

Mr. F. Berryman appeared for the prosecution, and Mr. R. A. Young for a solicitor interested in the proceedings.
